- On page 32, in Table 18 “Format of OVERALL DESCRIPTOR and ELEMENT DESCRIPTOR,” swap the “LSB” and “MSB” labels in bytes 2 and 3 (DESCRIPTOR LENGTH).
- On page 68, in Table A.2 “Configuration page, using sub-enclosure identifiers,” for the sub-enclosure descriptor labeled “First sub-enclosure descriptor,” change the “Bytes” column entry for PRODUCT REVISION LABEL from “(8 bytes)” to “(4 bytes)” and change the entry for VENDOR SPECIFIC ENCLOSURE INFORMATION from “(p – 40 bytes)” to “(p – 36 bytes).”

For the sub-enclosure descriptor labeled “Last sub-enclosure descriptor,” change the “Bytes” column entry for PRODUCT REVISION LABEL from “(8 bytes)” to “(4 bytes)” and change the entry for VENDOR SPECIFIC ENCLOSURE INFORMATION from “(p – 40 bytes)” to “(p – 36 bytes).”
